t is the mission of AAPAW to bring animal welfare organizations, veterinarians, and the community together in partnership to improve the lives of animals in the San Antonio area.

erving as a central resource to help coordinate and solidify the efforts of the city, animal welfare organizations, the San Antonio Area Foundation, businesses, individual community members, and the veterinarian community, AAPAW is able to succeed in supporting the local animal community as a whole. AAPAW is committed to providing the San Antonio area with overall leadership on animal welfare issues by connecting knowledgeable animal advocates and professionals and providing a platform to collaborate. This collaboration leads to increased likelihood of smaller rescues, working hard to improve lives of neglected animals in the city and surrounding area, making well informed and educated decisions on the care and well-being of the animals they rescue.

APAW provides programs and support to the community and rescue efforts that enable the success of the Animal Care Strategic Plan for the City of San Antonio. In part, this is done by implementing the following programs:

\*Ensuring that every adoptable homeless dog or cat is matched with a safe and loving home by providing large scale adoption events for members who are not able to organize events and market their animals in a way that is conducive to their funds and resources.

- \* Ending overpopulation by increasing spay and neuter activities by providing vouchers to rescues who often struggle with funding. In addition, AAPAW also works with veterinarians and clinics to negotiate lower pricing and animal rescue benefits.
- \* Educating citizens in order to prevent animal abuse and promote pet retention through responsible pet ownership through community connections on message boards.
- \* Investing in medical procedures for easy to treat, but costly, injuries and conditions such as heart worm disease.

## Highlights

APAW continued its partnership with SpaySA providing free spay/neuter vouchers to our members. This enables our rescue members to more quickly prepare rescued animals for adoption into fur-ever homes, thus making room for additional homeless animals to be rescued. Funds for this program are raised year-round through donations, fundraisers, and grants.

ffective October 1, 2013, the City of San Antonio's Animal Care Services discontinued animal control for areas of Bexar County outside the city limits. Accordingly, AAPAW is working with Bexar County to set up rescue and veterinarian alliances so that animals can go straight to rescues. It is expected that as we continue to work together, there will be many other ways that we could aid the County, such as officer training. The County program provides opportunities for AAPAW to be of valuable assistance throughout our community to animal welfare and to our animals specifically.
