(AAPAW) serves as a central resource to help coordinate and solidify the efforts of the city, animal welfare organizations, businesses, individual community members, veterinarians, and the local animal community as a whole. AAPAW is committed to providing the San Antonio area with leadership on animal welfare issues by connecting knowledgeable animal advocates and professionals and providing a platform to collaborate. This collaboration leads to increased likelihood of smaller rescues, working hard to improve lives of neglected animals in the city and surrounding area, to make well informed and educated decisions on the care and well-being of the animals they rescue.



Programs

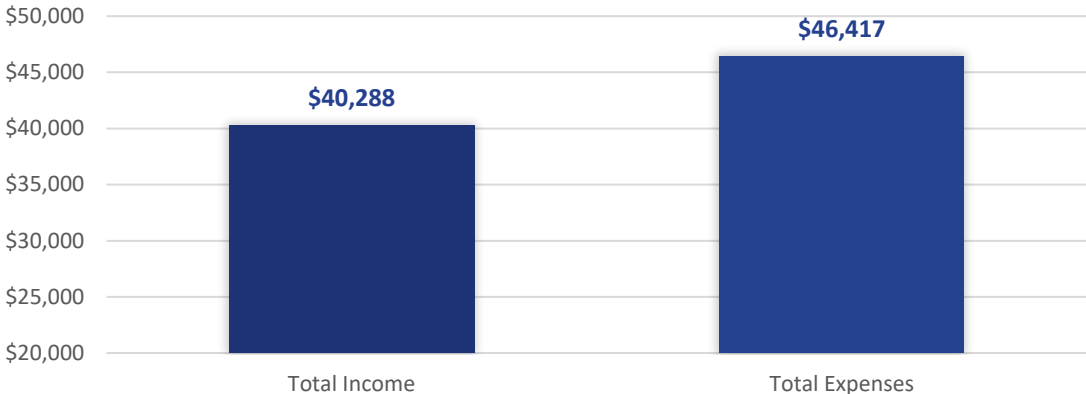
AAPAW provides support to the community and its rescue group members by implementing the following programs:

- * **Spay/Neuter** – Reducing overpopulation by increasing spay and neuter activities by providing vouchers to our rescue group members. In addition, AAPAW also works with veterinarians and clinics to negotiate lower pricing. **In 2017, we provided funding and support for 132 spay/neuter procedures.**
- * **Heartworm** - Investing in medical procedures to treat heart worm disease in rescued animals. AAPAW provides vouchers to our rescue group members to help offset costs and connects rescues and individuals with clinics willing to treat such conditions at reasonable costs. **In 2017, we provided funding and support for 114 heartworm treatments.**
- * **Good Samaritan** - Small, matching grants are provided to citizens and rescues to assist with various emergency medical treatments. **In 2017, we provided funding and support for 8 Good Samaritan cases.**
- * **Freebie Program** – Designed to provide free spay/neuters to those in need of financial assistance in and around Bexar County. **In 2017, we provided funding and support for 57 procedures.**

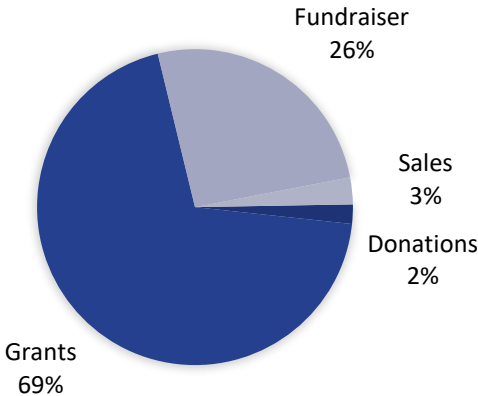

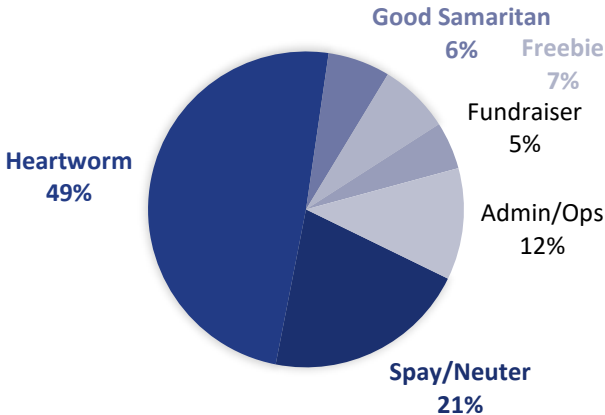
Profit & Loss
